

COVID Policies Summer Camp 2022

These policies will revolve around 5 basic prevention strategies around covid:

1. Masking
2. Testing
3. Cohorting
4. Ventilation
5. Quarantine

A key component of these policies is based on prevalence and hospitalization. The CDC has created Covid community levels of *Low*, *Medium* and *High*. These categorizations are based on [three metrics](#) - Case Rate per 100,000 population, New COVID-19 admissions per 100,000 population, and Percent of Staffed inpatient beds in use by patients with confirmed COVID-19.

We will use these CDC levels of Low, Medium and High throughout our policies. These levels will be based on the areas that campers are coming from.

Masks:

- Low Level - Campers will not be required to wear masks indoors.
- Medium Level - Campers will all be required to wear masks when multiple adventure groups gather indoors.
- High Level - We will avoid having multiple campers gather indoors, but masks will be required if this is necessary.

Testing:

- We will test any camper or staff person displaying covid symptoms.
- We will test all staff and campers that are members of an adventure group that had a participant test positive.
- All unvaccinated staff will test every Sunday.

Cohorts:

- Low and Medium Level – We will operate as in a typical year
- High Level – We will restrict all indoor gatherings to a single Adventure Group only. This would include serving breakfast outside.

Ventilation:

- Camper cabins will maintain proper **ventilation** by leaving windows open throughout the day and night.
- All camper sleeping areas will have air purifiers with HEPA filters that circulate the entire volume of the room's air 5 times per hour.

Quarantine:

- All campers and staff that test positive for covid will be quarantined until they can return home.
- All campers in the same adventure group as a camper or staff that tests positive will stay within their cabin and adventure group and will not directly interact with other members of the camp community.
